

RV@Olympic Dog Policy

Guest policy for RV sites, cabins, and common areas

RV@Olympic is a dog-friendly campground. To keep the park safe, clean, and enjoyable for all guests, every guest is responsible for their dog’s behavior, supervision, waste cleanup, and any damage caused by their dog. Management may require any dog to be removed from the property if the dog creates a safety concern, repeated disturbance, or sanitation issue.

1. Dog registration and guest responsibility

- All dogs must be disclosed at reservation or check-in. Management may ask for the dog’s name, breed/type, approximate size, vaccination status, and emergency contact information.
- Unless management approves otherwise in advance, guests may bring up to two dogs per site or unit.
- Dogs must have current rabies vaccination and any license required by applicable law.
- Guests are responsible for all injury, damage, extra cleaning, disturbance, or loss caused by their dog.

2. Behavior expectations

- Aggressive, hostile, threatening, or disruptive dogs are not permitted.
- A dog may be required to leave if it bites, attempts to bite, growls or lunges at guests or staff, repeatedly escapes, acts territorial, or creates a credible safety concern.
- Excessive barking, whining, howling, or other repeated noise is not permitted at any time, including while a dog is inside an RV, vehicle, cabin, or other unit.
- Dogs must not disturb other guests, enter another guest’s site, chase wildlife, or damage landscaping, buildings, vehicles, fencing, utilities, or campground property.

3. Leash, supervision, and unattended dogs

- Dogs must remain under the control and visual supervision of their owner or handler at all times.
- A maximum 6-foot leash is required whenever a dog is outside the guest’s RV, vehicle, cabin, or designated off-leash area, if any.
- Retractable leashes must be locked at 6 feet or shorter in common areas.
- Dogs may not be tied, tethered, kenneled, or left unattended outdoors.
- Dogs left unattended inside an RV, vehicle, cabin, or unit must be safe, quiet, temperature-controlled, and not disruptive. Management may contact the guest or require action if a dog appears distressed, unsafe, or disruptive.

4. Waste cleanup and sanitation

- Guests must immediately pick up and properly dispose of all dog waste anywhere on the property.

- Dog waste may not be left at sites, on trails, in landscaped areas, near cabins, or in common areas.
- Guests may be charged for cleanup, sanitation, damage, or odor remediation caused by their dog.

5. Where dogs are and are not allowed

- Dogs are allowed at guest RV sites and in designated dog-friendly outdoor areas, subject to leash and supervision rules.
- Dogs are not allowed inside bathhouses, laundry rooms, offices, stores, playgrounds, pools or water-feature areas, maintenance areas, or other posted restricted areas, except for service animals as required by law.
- Dogs are allowed in cabins or rental units only if the unit is designated dog-friendly and the dog was disclosed and approved at booking or check-in.
- Guests should use designated dog-walk areas when available and must respect posted signage.

6. Fees, damage, and removal

- Any applicable pet fee, cabin pet fee, cleaning fee, or deposit will be disclosed at booking or check-in.
- Pet fees do not cover damage, excessive cleaning, waste cleanup, odor remediation, or guest disruption.
- Management may require a dog to be removed from the campground, or may require the guest to find alternate accommodations, if this policy is violated.
- Repeated or serious violations may result in removal of the guest's party without refund, subject to management discretion and applicable law.

7. Long-term and extended-stay guests

- Long-term and extended-stay guests must keep dogs from becoming territorial over sites, walkways, common areas, staff, or neighboring guests.
- Outdoor pens, fencing, crates, dog houses, tie-outs, or similar setups require management approval and may be denied or removed at management's discretion.
- Management may periodically review pet compliance for extended-stay guests and may revoke pet privileges for repeated issues.

8. Service animals

Service animals are welcome at RV@Olympic in accordance with applicable law. Service animals are not pets and are not subject to pet fees, pet deposits, or ordinary pet restrictions.

- When the need for a service animal is not obvious, staff may ask only whether the dog is required because of a disability and what work or task the dog has been trained to perform.
- Staff will not ask about the guest's disability, require medical documentation, require a special identification card, require proof of training, or ask the dog to demonstrate its task.
- Service animals must remain under the handler's control. A service animal may be required to leave if it is out of control and the handler does not take effective action to control it, or if the animal is not housebroken or poses a direct threat to health or safety.
- Service animals may accompany guests in areas where guests are normally allowed, subject to applicable safety rules.
